Philip Jacob Peace Memorial Award
Full-time Graduate and Undergraduate Students of UH are Eligible

Up to \$800 can be awarded

This award was established in memory of Professor Philip E. Jacob (1914-1985), who devoted his personal and academic life to the search for peace and intercultural understanding. Dr. Jacob was convinced that war and the preservation of human values are incompatible with each other. He tried through scholarship, teaching, and public service to strengthen bonds of international cooperation and the processes of peacemaking.

This award will be given to a student who demonstrates, through: a) a completed project; b) a proposed project; or c) an equivalent endeavor that shows a commitment to peacemaking leadership, peace studies, conflict resolution, intercultural understanding, or other efforts toward achieving peace.

Eligibility: Applicant must be a full-time graduate or undergraduate student of the **University of Hawai'i system** and demonstrate an interest in peacemaking leadership, peace studies, conflict resolution, or intercultural understanding. Must have maintained at least a 2.5 grade point average.

Evaluation Criteria:

Applicants will be evaluated on their ability show: the proposal or project's merit; its potential or achieved impact; and the likelihood of successful completion for proposals, or demonstration of success for completed projects. Applicant's ability and academic record will also be considered. If no suitable applications are received, no awards will be made.

Scholarship Requirements:

- Completed and signed application cover page (attached to cover of application)
- Unofficial transcript of academic record
- Proof of current full-time enrollment as a graduate or undergraduate in the **University of Hawai'i system**.
- One-page essay describing a completed, proposed, or current project or equivalent endeavor, which demonstrates a commitment to peacemaking leadership, peace studies, conflict resolution, or intercultural understanding.
- Letter of recommendation from an instructor or peace advocate with whom you have been closely associated.
