Nobumoto Tanahashi Graduate Fellowship

(Up to \$5,000 is available and will be applied to Fall 2017 tuition.)

Full-time doctoral students from the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa may apply.

This award was established in memory of Reverend Nobumoto Tanahashi (1906-1996), founder of the Heiwa Kyokai (Order of Peace Congregation), a school of Shintoism that is committed to peace. The Reverend Tanahashi was an independent Japanese businessman who made the cause of world peace his personal mission.

Eligibility for Fellowship

- Must be enrolled full-time in a doctoral program at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa
- Completion of graduate course work, formation of a dissertation committee, and acceptance by that committee of a dissertation proposal
- A dissertation project that makes significant contribution to the field of peace studies, including conflict resolution, nonviolence, democracy, etc.

Evaluation Criteria

The Tanahashi Award Committee will evaluate applicants in terms of how significantly their dissertation project will contribute to the body of knowledge relative to peace studies, conflict resolution, nonviolence, democracy, and other related fields of study, and the likelihood of successful completion. If no suitable applications are received, no awards will be made.

Fellowship Application Requirements

- Completed and signed application cover page (attached to cover of application)
- Cover letter
- Unofficial transcript of academic record and proof of full-time doctoral student status
- One to two page summary or explanation of the applicant's dissertation project, emphasizing the work that will be done during the fellowship year, methods, and expected date of completion.
