Undergraduate Certificate in Peace Studies

Equivalent to a minor at the University of Hawai'i, the 15-credit Undergraduate Certificate in Peace Studies broadens students' perspectives and strengthens critical thinking on issues of war and peace, justice and human rights, and governance.

The Certificate exposes students to the fundamentals of peace and conflict resolution while they learn methods to manage and resolve conflict. These skills are highly valued by employers in a wide range of professional fields, making the certificate a nice compliment to many popular majors.

Some students may wish to focus primarily on peace studies as a personal intellectual endeavor. Others may seek a career in an area relevant to peace studies and will use the peace certificate to enhance their credentials and expertise.
