# **Lessons from the Ok Tedi Mine Environmental Dispute Resolution in Papua New Guinea**

Peter Adler, President and CEO of The Keystone Center, is helping resolve a case that pits native peoples against one of the largest copper and gold mines in Papua New Guinea. The case is a true sustainability dilemma: the indigenous food webs of 50,000 people have been disrupted but the mine also produces 20% of the country's GDP and most of the jobs, health, and education services that 50,000 people receive. What would you do? Peter will talk about this case, the impact that it is having on the country, and the unique process his team is leading.
