Brien Hallett teaches peace studies in the Spark M. Matsunaga Institute for Peace and Conflict Resolution. Professor Hallett is on the Steering Committee of the War and Peace project, based at Sokendai (Center for Advanced Studies Research) in Hayama, Japan, which sponsors workshops and summer research projects. He is the faculty coordinator for the annual Hiroshima and Peace program, which joins 25 Japanese and 25 foreign students (including students from the University of Hawai`i) for intensive study of the atomic bombings in Hiroshima. Professor Hallett is an expert on presidential war powers and author of *The Lost Art of Declaring War* (University of Illinois Press, 1998).
